# <u>Minutes of Directors' Meeting held at the Brewery Offices at 3.30 p.m.</u> <u>on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> January 1899</u>

<u>Present:</u> J. Dodds, Chairman, H. Baehr, W. R. Bennett, F. S. James, and (by invitation) M. Kirkwood

<u>The Minutes of the previous meetings</u> of 16<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> December, 1898 were read and confirmed.

#### Consulting Engineer

<u>Consulting Engineer</u> In connection with this matter the question as to whether it would be better to secure a superior permanent Engineer was considered, but while the opinion was held that the services of a local consulting Engineer would be sufficient it was decided not to make any appointment until the erection of the new machinery was about to commence.

## Hydrostatic Test of Boilers

<u>Hydrostatic Test of Boilers</u> In view of the present cleaning operations affording an opportunity of making the test recommended by Mr. Tresize, last summer, the advisability of doing so was considered. The boilers having been examined by Engineer-Surveyor Macnab on 22<sup>nd</sup> March last and reported upon as being "in excellent condition and in a good state of preservation" and as the Company's Engineer Chemnitz verbally also reported them to be in perfect order it was resolved not to make any test in the meantime particularly as unnecessary strain might thereby be placed on the boilers.

<u>Bottling Room Extension</u> The Secretary reported that this extension, declared by Mr. Heckert – who had by this time attended by request – to be necessary to meet the larger business expected and otherwise prepared for next Summer, would cost, together with works required to complete the most recently constructed Fermentation Room, about Yen 4,000.00.

## Reconstruction of Company

<u>Reconstruction of Company</u> Further alterations and suggestions by Mr. Walford were considered and decided upon and the Secretary was instructed to call on Mr. Walford and arrange accordingly with him and at the same time to discuss as to the best time to hold a general meeting at which to propose the scheme in a complete form.
